I'm reminded this time of year of the insightful words from Edward Hays. He was a man of deep faith who went on to the Church Triumphant earlier this year. His words always seem fitting no matter what season of life we find ourselves in. Please enjoy!

Each year we rejoice in this marvelous season of Christmas. It is a time for celebration, gift giving and remembering with cards, letters and parties. The reason of course, for all the music and lights, the festive spirit and good feelings, is an event that happened in a small village where the Jewish prophets had foretold that the Messiah would be born. When the birth took place, it seemed that no one remembered the ancient prophecy, and so people were looking for Emmanuel in other places. I would invite us all this Advent season to stop, be still, and to open our eyes and look. Which way is Bethlehem? It's closer than we think. Make room for Christ to be reborn in the Bethlehems of our homes and daily lives. Happy Advent and Merry Christmas!


Many Thanks!


