



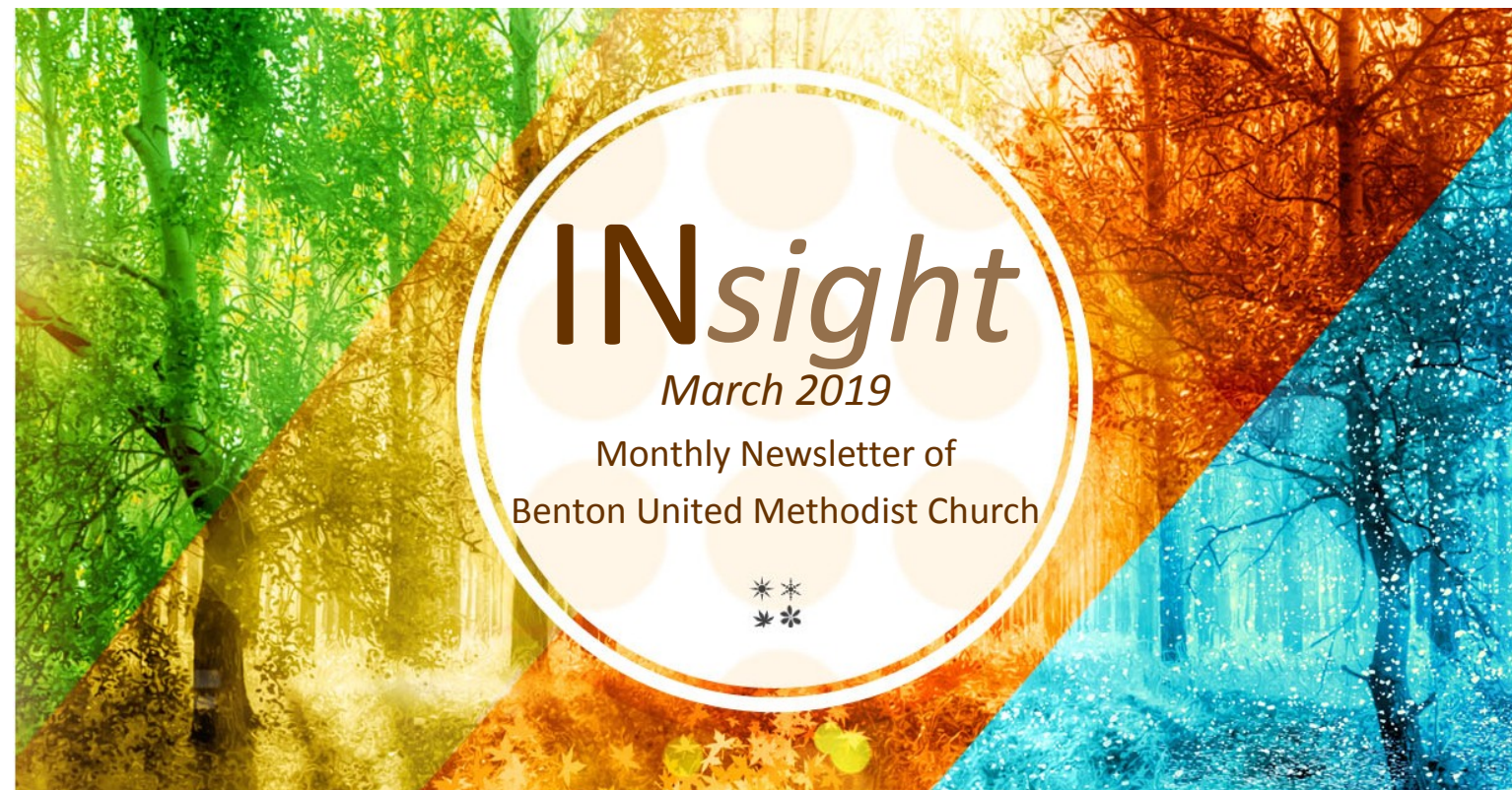

A Word From Pastor Brad

Dear Church,

As we approach Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season ponder this—what would your Lent be like if the mark on your forehead were made not with removable ashes, but with a forty-day dye? For one thing each morning and evening when you looked in a mirror, you would be reminded that you are a marked person, one who is homeward bound for heaven. For our spiritual ancestors, the people of Jewish and other Near Eastern cultures, wearing ashes was a sign of mourning and lamenting. Ashes were usually associated with sackcloth, which was clothing worn to mourn the death of a beloved or to lament a personal or communal disaster. In the early church, sackcloth and ashes were signs that marked the people who needed to do public penance throughout Lent, not just on Ash Wednesday.

As we come to be “marked” on Ash Wednesday, remember the why behind this sacred act—O God, today may I often trace the cross upon my forehead as I say, “I am dust that will return to dust, yet in God I trust.” Amen and Amen. Be blessed.

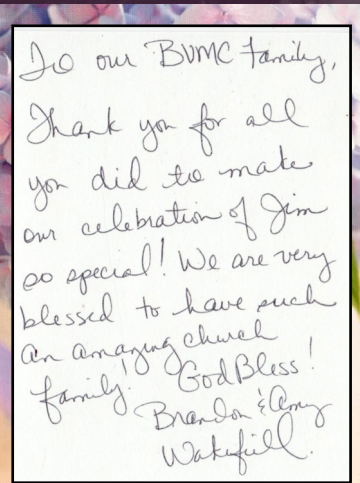

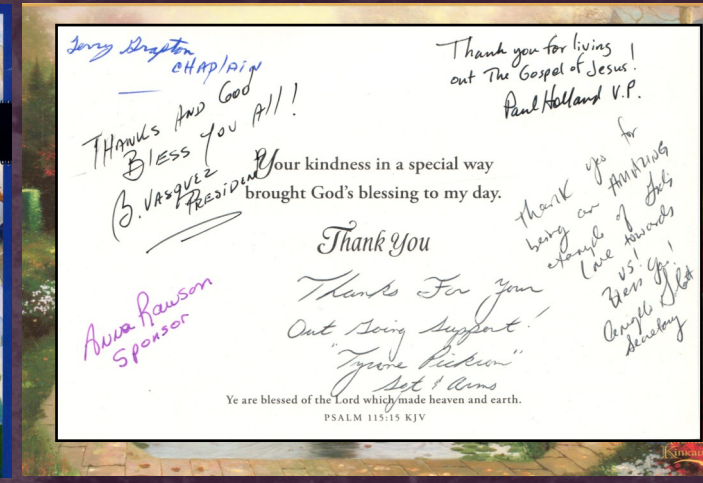
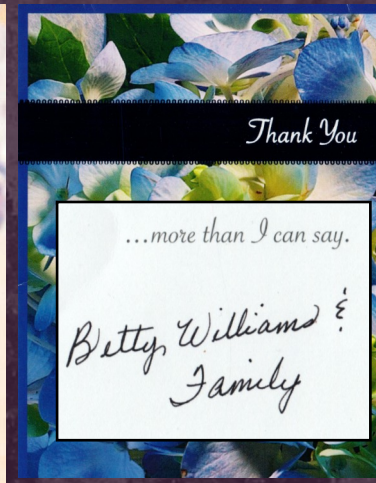
Nurturing Ministries Need YOU!

Pastor Brad has encouraged all of us in the Benton UMC church family to get involved in some ministry of the church. Just think about what you're passionate for, and then, consider your schedule – what do you really enjoy doing, and can you fit it in with your routine? However you choose to get involved, it will bless you in so many ways. There are many mission ministries in our church for you to participate in, but I want to remind you of the nurturing ministries that also need your help. These focus mostly on the church family.

- **Prayer Ministry**—the prayer team meets every Tuesday at 9:00 a.m. in the Prayer Chapel on the second floor – just come; everyone is welcome.
- **Prayer Chain**—the prayer chain is alerted at times of emergency and prayers are spoken immediately when they get the text; just contact Nancy Stinson (318) 455-4350 to be added to the chain.
- **The Shepherd Ministry**—it is designed so every member of the church family has a "shepherd" to call when they have a need or question, or new contact data. It is also a fast way for the church office to get information sent to the members or to use as a disaster response. We are in need of 2 shepherds now; just call Pastor Cheryl at (318) 422-0914 if you would like to volunteer – or if you need a shepherd.
- **Holy Communion Servers**—Holy Communion is very important to us. We need servers every 1st Sunday at both worship services.
- **Lay Eucharistic Ministers**—they take Communion to those who cannot come on 1st Sundays. There are 6 now who administer to 9 or 10 people, but there are that many more who need to receive Communion. If you would like to participate in either of these ministries, see Pastor Cheryl.
- **Study Leaders, Sunday School Teachers & Substitutes**—We are always open to new Bible studies, prayer & share groups, any small group activity that builds fellowship; just contact Pastor Brad and he will guide you.

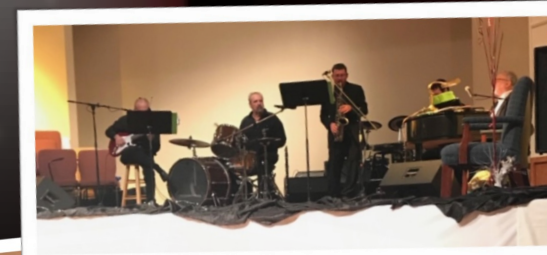

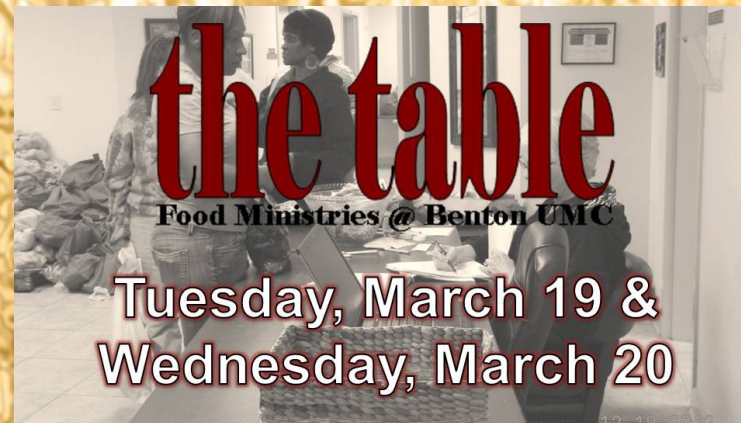
The Closet Clothes Ministry meets every Wednesday at Benton UMC and A Cross Faith. They sort the clothing at the church, just like we did at WOW!
