
# **Committee Summaries**


## Raise the Roof Campaign

To begin with I want to from my heart thank those who have sacrificed a great deal to contribute above your normal tithe to help this project. As of March 14, 2016 you have added over \$5,670 to the \$16,300 we had at the end of Jan 2016 for a new total of \$21,970 collected. This equals 100 of the 160 squares needed to cover the roof of the Daycare building. Another look shows we are at 63% of the \$35,000 needed to get the job done. We have 7 weeks remaining before our projected start date to replace the roof with 35 year shingles. A suggestion to go along without 2 Starbucks a week or cutting one time eating out a week and donating that money to Raise the Roof Project



is this: this Sunday I will be donating 10% of my federal tax refund to the Raise the Roof project. Pray about doing the same and keep thinking about how you can help as we complete Lent and celebrate the Risen Lord we follow.
