A Word From Pastor Brad

Dear Church.

Recently I offered this devotional to the staff before our March meeting. It spoke to me as I hope it will speak to you. Be blessed this Easter and proclaim with a joyful heart that Jesus is Risen!

A springtime refection on planting a garden might provide us with some insights into the meaning of Easter. Planting potatoes in some parts of the United States is a ritual that takes place on St. Patrick's Day or Good Friday, but the ritual is ancient. Before planting potatoes, you must first cut out those pieces containing eyes. Then those pieces are ready to be buried in the good soil of the garden.

In a play on words we see a similar relationship between Easter and the destruction of the "I". For without cutting out the "I", without the death of the ego, there can be no personal resurrection experience. Easter is a joyous event which we may express with elaborate alleluias, feasting, new clothes, candy rabbits and brightly decorated eggs. But it is a painful experience as well! Easter is the celebration of the resurrection, but a resurrection implies death. We are eager to celebrate life but reluctant to die first!

The death of Easter is more than the death of the body. It is that deeper death of the "I". If we seek holiness and wholeness, we must "cut out" the great "I" and bury it. The "I" wants to have its own way and to have it right now, with no compromise and no opposition. We want what we want when we want it!

Part of the mystery of this death to the self is found in service to others, and part of it is found in the ability to invest oneself in something greater than the self. We all need a "beyond" to which we can consecrate ourselves, a dedication to something bigger, greater, and more transcendent than the self. We need to find something worth the investment of our whole self, an investment that can be made with our whole heart.

This Easter season make the life changing investment of burying the "I" of self and be made new through the resurrection good news that Jesus is Alive.



There are stages of grief that need to be worked through in order to recover a healthy outlook, and sometimes, people need help with this journey. Benton UMC is preparing to begin a Grief Ministry which will provide just such a support group, open to the community, that will meet weekly during the evening or on weekend. There will be a trained facilitator leading the group in six-week sessions.

People experience grief for many reasons – loss of a job or a life-style, loss of a loved one or a marriage. The grief support group will provide a safe place for them to share their pain (and what has helped) with others in a similar situation, while being guided through the stages of grief. The meetings are always grounded in spiritual practices and are strictly confidential. We have seen a need in our church family for this ministry and believe God is leading us in this endeavor.




