

As we move into the Easter season of our lives I wanted to offer a story that a West Virginia preacher once shared with me. It captures the Easter story in a powerful way. Enjoy.

Years ago there was a little one-room schoolhouse in the mountains of Virginia where the boys were so rough that no teacher had been able to handle them.

A young, inexperienced teacher applied, and the old director scanned him and asked: "Young fellow, do you know that you are asking for an awful beating? Every teacher that we have had here for years has had to take

"I will risk it," he replied.

The first day of school came, and the teacher appeared for duty. One big fellow named Tom whispered: "I won't need any help with this one. I can lick him myself."

The teacher said, "Good morning, boys, we have come to conduct school." They yelled and made fun at the top of their voices. "Now, I want a good school, but I confess that I do not know how unless you help me. Suppose we have a few rules. You tell me the rules you want, and I will write them on the blackboard."

One fellow yelled, "No stealing!" Another yelled, "On time." Finally, ten rules appeared on the blackboard.

"Now," said the teacher, "a law is not good unless there is a penalty attached. What shall we do with anyone who breaks the rules?"

"Beat him across the back ten times without his coat on," came the response from the class.

"That is pretty severe, boys. Are you sure that you are ready to stand by

But another yelled, "I second the motion."




# OPALS. (Older People with Active Life Styles)



# Community Service Spotlight





Benton United Methodist Church and our Mission Team would like to thank the Benton Middle School D.I. Team for their generous donation to our Emergency Food Pantry. On Tuesday, February 27, a group of middle school youth delivered 1302 non-perishable food items—those will fill 60 emergency boxes of food! The team created a contest for each class and the class that brought in the most items won a cupcake party!

Caroline Moore had called a few weeks before and asked who and how many our pantry served, what types of food it gave out, and if there were any requirements. For the emergency food pantry, there are no requirements—just that a person or family is in need. We serve anywhere from 3-15 a month and sometimes more! We are also an agency of the Northwest Louisiana Food Bank and that program does have requirements. Our emergency pantry allows us to help those who may fall through the cracks, are not able to immediately locate the necessary paperwork for the NWLA Pantry, are transient, or in another temporary situation (house fire, fleeing from abuse, unexpected expenses, etc.)

Thank you again, D.I. Team, for your hard work and compassion that extends our outreach to the community!

We have free childcare available for all who RSVP by April 18th.



On the night of this fire in Plain Dealing, LA: "Camo, my pit bull dog, drug me from my bed and drug me out of those flames into the yard to safety. She thought my daughters Kalee and Halee were in their room sleeping and went back into the house to get them and the roof fell on her and she was overcome by the smoke and didn't make it. I felt as if she was an angel that saved my life. She is because God needed her and through his grace she also gave her life to save mine." Sheri Thompson recalled. "The following days after the horrific tragedy I began to find peace but felt I had lost everything that I cherished, Camo was my best friend. I was in such a dark place and felt as if I had lost everything that I valued. I had no clothes, shoes, no home, I had lost my whole life it seemed. I prayed hard and I asked God to guide me and help me rebuild my life. The day of the fire I had so many people come to see me and bring food, clothes, money, toiletries, household goods and I realized that the love, generosity, and so many beautiful inspirational cards each containing his message to me not to lose my faith in him, and trust him. I knew in my heart that God's work was being done through the people that care for me. God is Good and he is my Lord and Savior."



For this fire, specifically, we were able to meet clothing and household item needs through The Closet Clothes Ministry. But there were many churches and community members that have reached out and shown the love of Christ to Sheri. Please keep her family in your prayers for comfort and strength.
