


Update on Security System Fundraiser

Hello, my name is Patrick Thomas. My wife, Jessica, and I have been extremely blessed to answer the Lord and to serve as Camp Caney's hosts! As you know, Camp Caney is one of only three camping ministries maintained by the Louisiana Conference. The Monroe and Shreveport districts see that Campy Caney is a wonderful mission that works to transform the lives of many children, youth, and adults, past, present, and future!

Camp Caney holds a special place in my heart that no other place can ever hold; it's where I found the Lord Jesus Christ. It is where my transformation started as a Christian. 
Camp Caney Work Day List – May 12, 2018 at 8:00 am

- 1. The first curve on the main road once you enter the gate is washing away. I would like to have the same look that we have in front of the cafeteria with a wood retaining wall
- 2. Cut all marked trees in the wooded area and make walking trails by the lake.
- 3. Need tractors to help remove all trees and put them in burn pile.
- 4. Replace a few boards on the pier that have splintered.
- 5. Replace steps that are missing on the ladder that goes in/out of the water.
- 6. Tear down obstacle course and clean that area up so it can be used.
- 7. Need blowers and rakes to start from the back of campus and work to the very front of campus. Need to blow and rake years of pine straw and leaf build up.
- 8. Clear all debris from behind old manager house-I have a dumpster provided by Stallion to put everything in.
- 9. Clear and manicure the cross/hill and swimming area
- 10. Seal all wooden boxes and posts on the outside of each cabin.
- 11. Need limb saws—need to trim all trees on the campus.
- 12. The area behind the Rec Hall and concession stand-we need to completely clean up and have it trimmed.

- 13. The area to the left of the fire pit- we need to clean and trim all trees.
- 14. Replace all wooden benches with expanded metal benches so they won't wear and rot like the wooden ones. (these need to be donated-there are about 10 throughout the campus)
- 15. Replace all the wooden picnic tables throughout the campus. I would also like for these to be expanded metal so they won't wear and rot like the wooden ones. (these would also need to be donated- there are about 10 of these as well).
- 16. Replace boards on bridge going to the lake from the cross.
- 17. Put metal railing along all sidewalks to accommodate people who are disabled or elderly.
- 18. Put in sidewalks from Rec Hall to the sitting area to the Dining hall. 19. Trim all trees around campus.

Things to bring: chainsaws, rakes, blowers (gas powered), limb saws, tractors, power tools, hammers, and gloves.
