We all together all year long to pack shoeboxes so that as many children as possible will hear the good news of our Lord and Savior. Jesus Christ.

Here are the numbers for this year:

Worldwide - 10 623 77

USA - 8,801,607

Texas/Louisiana - 733,306

Northwest Louisiana 21 4

3.96 million shoebox recipients participated in the follow-up discipleship program "The Greatest Journey"

2.77 million graduated from "The Greatest Journey" which is the highest yearly total to date.

More than 2 million students made decisions for Christ in 2018. This is the largest number since the program began in 2009. This means that children around the world are hungry to know about our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.


Even though the number of shoeboxes is down, the number of children receiving Jesus and going through the Discipleship Program is up. Thank you Jesus!!!!!



La Conference Apportionment amount for 2019 is \$44,828.00. We have paid \$11,715.75 for first quarter. Balance \$33,112.25. We are paying \$3,905.21 per month.

Mortgage note balance \$ 217,375.91 Monthly note is \$5,661.61

Note for Air conditioners for Family Life Center balance \$8,409.40 Monthly note is 2,152.33

We needed air conditioners for office area and the United Methodist Men paid \$12,500. Thanks to the UMM.

Phase one of the Security System has been completed and expenses have been paid.

















Many Manks...


