


Gerald & Nancy Sandidge

Joe Madden



Seeds For the Harvest Community Garden

In March, the Seeds For the Harvest Community Garden team, along with some dedicated volunteers, built raised garden beds for people in our community. Applications for the raised beds were sent out during an earlier food distribution day and 15 applications came back! Out of the 15 applications, 10 were approved. There were requirements for having a garden, such as a working water source and a place where the sun would shine for the better part of the day. The garden team is working to help those who were not approved this year, to prepare for a future garden.

In April, the beds and compost were delivered, along with some tomato and pepper plants. The team has already made another visit and they found that not only were the beds planted and doing well, but the residents had mowed and cleaned up their yards—especially around the gardens! The team will continue to visit regularly to check on the progress, offer assistance, and just be in the community.


