





We are committed to wiping out preventable blindness throughout the world. One way you can help us achieve that commitment is by donating your old or no longer used eyeglasses and hearing aids. Lions Clubs throughout Louisiana collect and recycle used eveglasses and hearing aids. The glasses are inspected for condition and the prescriptions determined. We can also use prescription sunglasses. They are then packaged up in 100 pair boxes and sent out with medical missionary teams all over the world. We recycle around 100,000 pairs a year and there is always a need. The hearing aids are evaluated and repaired if needed and sent along with the glasses.

This year 400 pair went to Uganda with a Cypress Baptist Mission spring trip.


