## **A Word From Pastor Brad**

**Dear Church** 

For the month of July we're going to be exploring several parables of Jesus. I love parables. Probably because there's both an engaging story and a truth about the Kingdom of God to glean from. And who doesn't enjoy a good story and a nugget of truth that can be applied in everyday life?

Kevin Halloran, a preaching professor that I follow, says that our understanding of a parable and its details should all flow from the main point (or points). This is a crucial step, because the main point of the parable is the reason Jesus said it in the first place!

Some recommended questions for finding the main point are:

- Who are the main characters?
- What occurs at the end?
- What occurs in quotation marks?
- Who/What is the focus of the story?

While longer parables share a lot of important details along the way, the key to understanding the implications of the parable is often found in its conclusion. In the parable of the Wheat and the Tares (Matthew 13:24-30), the ending reveals what happens to the wheat and tares respectively and shows the ultimate purpose of the parable which is to indicate that God will judge who is really part of the church at the final judgment.

Apply this insight to the next parable you read and see if you don't read and experience it differently. Happy reading!! Looking forward to exploring the Parables with you in July.





# Louisiana Annual Conference 2019

Every quadrennium at Annual Conference, delegates from all across the connection gather to elect lay and clergy delegates to both <u>General Conference</u> and <u>Jurisdictional Conference</u>.

The number of delegates an Annual Conference is entitled to send to a General Conference is based on two factors: the number of clergy members of the Annual Conference and the number of members of local churches in the Annual Conference.

In the case of Louisiana, this meant electing three clergy and three lay delegates to General and Jurisdictional Conference and two alternates for both clergy and lay for a total of sixteen.


